

HOW TO SCORE DURING THE GAME IN THE SCORE BOOK

This method usually adopted for scoring Teeball games is the DOT Method. It is simple and straight forward. Use the second page to score on as you follow the instructions below.

- (a) The batting line up is written down on the score sheet for each team.
- (b) The batters and runners' positions are shown by means of dots starting in the right segment (first base) proceeding anti-clockwise to top, left and bottom segments (home base).
- (c) Batter 1 safely made it each base, and then to Home. This was done one after the other as other batters hit. This is why the dots are done as individual dots. When a batter gets home, the inner circle is coloured Green.
- (d) Batter 2 was out and so the inner circle is coloured Red to indicate the batter was out.
- (e) Batter 3 made first base (dot in right segment) but was out before getting to second base when the next batter hit. As the batter was out, the inner circle is coloured Red again.
- (f) Batter 4 hit made it all the way around to Home Base (home run or just ran fast) shown by an arrow joining the four segments. The inner circle is coloured Green to show they made it home.
- (g) Batter 5 made it to second base safely (shown by arrow in two segments joining home to 2nd)
- (h) Batter 6 was out and as third batter out (third red dot in that inning), side is away. A diagonal line is put through the next batter's (Batter 7) score position to indicate the end of the innings and a horizontal line in the next innings shows Batter 7 is the first batter.
- (i) The score for the team for that innings (upper segment) and the total game (lower segment) is placed at the bottom (in this case 2 runs) of the innings column. The Green circles show runs scored.
- (j) The next innings for this team will start with batter 7.
- (k) In the example for the second innings, batter 7 reached first safely and made it all the way home on the home run of batter 8. Batters 9, 10, 11 were out without making it to a base. This is three out so the innings comes to a close. Score for innings two is 2 runs, which makes the total 4.
- (l) The next batter in the third innings will be batter 12 (who made it to first base due to a dot being placed in the right segment (1st base). The next batter will be Batter 1 again, and their score/base positions are entered in the third innings column (as this is the current innings). Batter 2 made it to first base (dot in right segment) and batter 12 made it to second base (dot in top segment).
